NATIONAL SAMPLE SURVEY TO ESTIMATE ANNUAL RISK OF TUBERCULOSIS INFECTION IN DIFFERENT PARTS OF INDIA

- Progress Report: Jan - December, 2001

This is in continuation of earlier reports published in previous four issues of NTI Bulletin regarding the survey, which is being conducted by the National Tuberculosis Institute as a nodal center. During the period; January to December 2001, approximately 69,665 children were investigated. The fieldwork has been completed in eighteen districts and is under progress in two other districts. The cumulative progress of the fieldwork till December, 2001 is as under:
